Theta Phi Alpha returns to the University of Nebraska, inviting 31 new members to become part of the newly established chapter.

Theta Phi Alpha Fraternity is pleased to announce the reinstatement of Mu chapter at the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, becoming the fifteenth NPC group to join the established Panhellenic system on campus.

The Mu chapter was chartered on the University of Nebraska–Lincoln campus in 1924, but closed in 1937. In 2009, an interest group formed with the intent to petition Theta Phi Alpha Fraternity to form a colony, which passed in the spring of 2010. The colony worked over the next year to fundraise and recruit new members and submitted their petition for reinstatement. They also held sisterhood events, philanthropic activities and attended Leadership Conference at Purdue University during the summer of 2011.

Initiation and reinstatement was held on September 23 and 24, 2011 with Grand Council President Kathy Gaver, AII and National Executive Secretary Laura Foley, X in attendance as well as Big Sister chapter Gamma Nu. Alumnae and collegians from Kappa, Chi and Alpha Pi chapters as well as Board of Trustees Chairman, Kristin Henkenius and NPC Delegate Erin Nemenoff also attended.

Founded in 1912, The Phi Alpha is a women's organization to provide close comradeship; to advance educational, social, and philanthropic interests and leadership training; to encourage spiritual development and adherence to the highest moral standards; and to promote lifelong bonds of friendship; a fraternity for college and university women and alumnae.
